VICE COMMODORE'S REPORT

The mailing of Stall Application forms has been completed. You are reminded of the January 31, 1978 deadline for the return of the completed form to insure consideration of your stall request.

As of this writing, December 11, 1977, plans for dock additions and repair and refurbishing are, to say the least, rather fluid. All work is dependent on the serverity of winter damage, and the amount of budgeted monies for docks and dock repair. If the weather to date is indicative of what can be expected for winter, (this is still Fall!) dock repair may be equally as extensive as was experienced last year. Also budget preparation has been delayed pending election of the Fleet Captain, Both of these items will be resolved prior to Christmas.

Current plans for dock improvement, in addition to normal maintenance, include a program for replacement of damaged concrete slab platforms with diamond checkered plate. Additional stalls are proposed along the north bulkhead, west of those erected in 1977, and in an extension to the south of piers M and N. To augment the stalls, moorings in greater number can be provided to the west, through locating and reactivating those lost in past years. Skin diver volunteers are sought for this effort.

Much of what can be accomplished is dependent on the ravages of the elements. With all due respect for our members who are skiers, skaters, ice boaters, snowmobilers or ice fishermen, please join me in a prayer for a mild winter.





"ONE MAN'S OPINION"

Boating getting expensive? Do you want to sail or power? What? You want to do both! How are you going to do that and have the crew or justify the expense? Problems, problems. I believe a reasonable answer to the whole question follows:

First ... buy an E-22, a 30' Etchells, in partnership with one other person. This keeps the boat active, helps the crew problem and reduces the cost of maintenance upkeep, insurance, etc. \$10,000. reduced to \$5,000! And for Erie sailing, you'll have as fine a sail boat as is on the bay. Now once the fleet takes shape, and say 10 partnerships become a reality, 20 owners will be involved. Get 10 of the 20 owners to each fork up \$10,000, and buy a Grand Banks 42, again in partnership. Bring the boat to Erie each summer, on its way to the North Channel from which it heads south down the Mississippi to say ... Commodore Schuler's Point Clear area, near the Gulf of Mexico; on its way to Florida or the Bahamas. Then spring comes and Hilton Head becomes a perfect stop on the way north to Long Island Sound. When was the last time (or was it the first time) an EYC boat went around Nova Scotia to the St. Lawrence, Quebec. Montreal? It is possible, you know. Or settle for the beautiful trip through the Erie Canal. But in any event, we'll eventually get 'er back to Erie. But in the meantime members of the EYC could have cruising like they've never had before and in a boat designed to go long distances. Cost of both boats ... \$15,000/ share, far less than one medium sized IOR, which often doesn't sail as well as my E-22, nor cruise really comfortably for weeks on end. A pipe dream? A fantasy? perhaps ... but not necessarily so(If you'd like to be a part of either concept, let me hear from you)
