
By the time this goes to press we should all be out on the water, hopefully enjoying good weather. As of this writing we are assigning slips to members with 4 points. This is a far cry from the 11 points we were at a little over a year ago, and shows how quickly things can change.

In order to alleviate perceived improprieties with respect to members violating the rules on boat ownership, the Dock Committee is requiring proof of ownership (eg: photocopy of state registration or documentation) be on file at the Club office before a slip can be assigned. This is in effect for all new boats being brought into the basin this year, and will be fully implemented next January. I believe that there is some confusion about how points are used to assign slips. According to the By-Laws, points shall determine only the eligibility for slip space, and do not allow "bumping"

to get a specific slip. When new docks do become open, they are assigned based on best fit. If two boats of similar size request the same slip, then the owner with the most points gets the slip. We try to satisfy specific requests as much as possible, but only about 30 slips open up each year. Best wishes for a good summer.

ERIE YACHT CLUB RACING FLEET

UNLIKE Dennis Conner's Stars and Stripes four straight unprecedented victories in the trouncing of Kookaburra III in the 1987 take-back of the America's Cup, the yacht Mary Lou captured the Erie Yacht Club "Boat of The Year" by a narrow 23 seconds in the last race of the 1992 racing season over a very well-sailed Example of the Property of the Prop

sailed **Foxylady** skippered by Eric Ambro.

During the long '92 racing season, the J-44 Mary Lou and the J-24 Foxylady each competed in their respective classes, however, overall results were also charted with the numbers earning Captain William Burke and crew the coveted Erie Yacht Club championship. The never-quit Andicapp, a Cal 33, took second place over the comparable "ultra light hull" of Gerry Diemel's Trader, a custom 40' by a narrow 4 points in Class A. Mary Lou captured the A Division Zurn Trophy awarded for first place.

In Class B (yachts with PHRF ratings over 160) it was Rick Kern's **Lions Pride** an S2 7.9 and Henry Borchardt's **Fog**, a Lindenberg 26 banging hulls to a season tie for the Class B title. David Haller's **Lanada**, a C&C 29, was a very close 1-1/4 points behind

for third place.

Class J (all J-24s) was very competitive and hopefully marked the resurgence of class racing in the Erie Yacht Club fleet. The season began slowly for the eventual winner, however, when the smoke cleared and the points were added up, he once again emerged at the head of his class. It was that wise and salty Eric Ambro on Foxylady. Pat Huntley, not to be confused with Dad and fellow J-24 racer Paul Huntley, placed second on Graffiti over Jack Bierley's Dilligara.

The J-24 class is looking ahead and will host the 1994 J-24 Great Lakes Championships here next summer, not to mention the District Championship this summer. Good luck to all of the local com-

petitors!



What do you do if it's the skipper, and he's the only one who knows how to run the boat? Then you would have to learn by experience! Experience may be an excellent teacher, but on the water, it could be fatal.

Now you have another option. In conjunction with National Safe Boating Week,

annually, the first week in June, the Erie Squadron of the United States Power Squadrons is conducting a two and one-half hour, one-evening "Skipper Saver" course and is recommended for spouses, family members, friends, fishing buddies or others who go as "guests." The course includes overviews on power and sailboat handling, man overboard procedures, first aid, knot-tying and radio telephone operation. This course is not a substitute for the Basic Boating courses taught by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, U.S. Power Squadrons, or PA Fish and Boat Commission, and does not qualify for the PA Boating Safety Certificate.

The "Skipper Saver" course will be held at the Erie Yacht Club on Tuesday June 8, with registration at 6:30 pm class starting at 7:00 pm. The cost of the course is \$8 per person or family to cover cost of material. For reservations call Len Schwemmer at 838-1070.


Junior Sailing Update



J-24 CHAMPIONSHIP A R E G A T T A

The J-24 District 12 Championship Regatta will be held at the Erie Yacht Club on June 17 to 20, 1993. District 12 encompasses the states of Michigan, Ohio, and Pennsylvania, but is likely to attract boats from New York state as well. A fleet of 25-30 boats is expected to conduct seven races over three days, both in the Bay

and out on Lake Erie. The J-24 is raced with a typical crew of four to five, many of which are wives, children and friends, all of which will be enjoying the newly refurbished surroundings of the Erie Yacht Club. This event will include many social aspects as well as a racing clinic sponsored by North Sails. Anyone interested in attending this clinic on "Tactics" is free to join the fleet on Friday, June 18 at 4:30 pm at EYC.

The J-24 class attracts some of the most talented sailors in the world, with national class associations in 22 countries and 105 active fleets in the United States alone. This ranks the J-24 as one of the most successful keelboat classes in the world. Class regattas include district, regional and national events with an annual world championship held on a regular basis. Erie will be the venue of the 1994 Great Lakes Championship which is a world qualifier event. The 1994 Regatta is likely to attract 50 to 60 J-24s with wide representation from across the northeast United States. This will be a major yachting event with significant recognition for the local fleet and the Erie Yacht Club.
